Keynote Remarks
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I appreciate the opportunity to share the stage with such a wonderful group of educators who are engaged in many pioneering efforts to improve teaching and learning in Europe and around the world. Specifically, I would like to thank Secretary General András Szûcs and President Morten Paulsen for graciously inviting me to speak here today. Since we have a very tight conference schedule today that is packed with many great activities, I will only take a few moments of your time.

In 2010, I founded the International Higher Education Teaching and Learning Association, known as HETL, with the aim of bringing together educators from every country, every educational institution, and every discipline from around the world to develop innovative ways to transform teaching and learning. Since its inception HETL has been a grass-roots effort - an organization of educators, by educators, and for educators. In doing so, we should consciously strive to foster learning environments that are joyful and meaningful. Doing this is important because education is a highly personal and social endeavor.

As such, we need to create learning environments that build self-confidence in students and learning environments that create an atmosphere where learning is highly valued and even considered cool! Educators today realize that human learning occurs in multiple ways: informally, collaterally, emotionally, socially, and tacitly, and not just cognitively and not just within the confines of a physical classroom. Education should be about engaging students in learning activities that are personally meaningful to each student and education should be about developing unique personalities that are more self-regulating and self-determining.

I encourage you to reflect on these issues as we dialogue with each other throughout the conference and I look forward to meeting many of you over the next few days. Thank you very much for your time!
